DON'T GIVE UP ON YOUR SEED...IT'S HARVEST TIME! Sunday, December 17th, 2017 Pastor Audie Clairmont

Galatians 6:9-AMP

And let us not lose heart and grow weary and faint in acting nobly and doing right, for in due time and at the appointed season we shall reap, if we do not loosen and relax our courage and faint.

Passion – 9 And don't allow yourselves to be weary or disheartened in planting good seeds, for the season of reaping the wonderful harvest you've planted is coming!

The word "weary" means "to be utterly <u>spiritless</u>, to be wearied out, <u>exhausted</u>."

Proverbs 11:25-Passion

25 Those who live to bless others <u>will have blessings</u> <u>heaped upon them</u>, and the one who pours out his life to pour out blessings <u>will be saturated with favor.</u>

KJV - And let us not be <u>weary</u> in <u>well doing</u>: for in <u>due</u> <u>season</u> we <u>shall reap</u>, <u>if</u> we <u>faint not</u>.

- "weary" depicts one who is <u>tempted to give up</u> because he feels confrontation by an evil, destructive, or unjust person or circumstance.
- 2. "well" means *good* but would be better translated here as <u>useful</u>.
- 3. "doing" refers to <u>any type of activity</u>.
- "due season" means -each seed has its <u>own set</u> <u>season</u> – a specific, individual time when it will produce a harvest.

If we are <u>consistent</u> — if we steadfastly keep sowing our seed into the ground and <u>refuse</u> to allow weariness to <u>derail us</u> — a <u>time will come</u> when we shall reap.

5. "shall reap" - a word that describes the reaping or harvesting of crops. It describes a <u>future, fixed event</u>.

6. "if" - tells us that <u>our actions</u> have the power to <u>disrupt</u> a harvest.

7. "faint" - means to loosen out. It is a relaxed mental state that results in loss.
