BEING OF GOOD COURAGE. Sunday, January 21st 2018 Pastor Audie Clairmont

Psalm 42:9-NKJV

9 I will say to God my Rock, "Why have You forgotten me? <u>Why do</u> <u>I go mourning because of the oppression of the enemy?"</u>

mourning – qadar (kaw-dar)-means <u>"to be dark."</u>...It refers to the darkening of the sky due to a storm, or the total absence of light.

Māsas (maw-sas) - which means "to melt or dissolve." ... to faint (with fatigue, fear or grief): - discourage melt (away)...

Psalm 22:14-15-AMP

14 I am poured out like water, and all my bones are out of joint. My heart is like wax; it is softened [with anguish] and melted down within me.

15 My strength is dried up like a fragment of clay pottery;...

Deuteronomy 1:28-AMP

28 To what are we going up? Our brethren have <u>made our hearts melt</u>, saying, the people are bigger and taller than we are; the cities are great and fortified to the heavens. And moreover we have seen the [giantlike] sons of the Anakim there.

What is the real cause, then, of discouragement? Unbelief.

Mark 6:6-AMP

6 And He (Jesus) marveled because of their unbelief (their lack of faith in Him).

To have victory over discouragement, we must embrace four principles:

1. We must stop looking at ourselves, and start looking at God.

Psalm 13:1-NLT

- 1...O LORD, how long will You forget me? Forever? How long will You look the other way?
- 2 How long must I struggle with anguish in my soul, with sorrow in my heart every day? How long will my enemy have the upper hand?
- 3 Turn and answer me, O LORD my God! Restore the sparkle to my eyes, or I will die.

Psalm 5:3-KJV

- **3** My voice shalt thou hear in the morning, O LORD; in the morning will I direct *my prayer* unto thee, and *will look up*.
- 2. We must stop looking at the past and start looking at the future.

Philippians 3:13-Passion

13 I don't depend on my own strength to accomplish this; however <u>I do have</u> <u>one compelling focus: I forget all of the past</u> as <u>I fasten my heart to the future</u> <u>instead.</u>

You need to look to what God is going to do in you and through you.

3. We must stop searching for reasons and start resting on promises.

2Corinthians 10:5-Murdock

5 And <u>we demolish imaginations</u>, and every lofty thing that exalteth itself against the <u>knowledge of God</u>, and subjugate (overpower) all reasonings to obedience to the Messiah.

Romans 1:17-AMP

- ...The man who through faith is just and upright shall live and shall live by faith.
- 4. We must be <u>strong</u> and <u>courageous</u> because of the Gods strength in us.

Deuteronomy 31:6-AMP

6 <u>Be strong, courageous, and firm; fear not nor be in terror before</u> <u>them</u>, for it is the Lord your God <u>Who goes with you; He will not</u> fail you or forsake you.

We are never alone because the <u>Holy Spirit dwells in us</u>, and we also always have <u>God's Word with us</u>.

Courage - actually means "boldness or bravery."

Galatians 6:9-AMP

9 And let us not lose heart and grow weary and faint in acting nobly and doing right, for in due time and at the appointed season we shall reap, *if we do not loosen and relax our courage and faint.*
