Hebrews 11:24-26, NKJV

By faith Moses, when he became of age, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter, choosing rather to suffer affliction with the people of God than to enjoy the passing pleasures of sin, esteeming the reproach of Christ greater riches than the treasures in Egypt; for he looked to the reward.

Galatians 6:7-8-Message Bible

Don't be misled: No one makes a fool of God. What a person plants, he will harvest. The person who plants selfishness, ignoring the needs of others—ignoring God!—harvests a crop of weeds. All he'll have to show for his life is weeds! But the one who plants in response to God, letting God's Spirit do the growth work in him, harvests a crop of real life, eternal life.

Exodus 3:2-NKJV

And the Angel of the Lord appeared to him in a flame of fire from the midst of a bush. So he looked, and behold, the bush was burning with fire, but the bush was not consumed.

Exodus 3:9-10-NKJV

Now therefore, behold, the cry of the children of Israel has come to Me, and I have also seen the oppression with which the Egyptians oppress them. Come now, therefore, and I will send you to Pharaoh that you may bring My people, the children of Israel out of Egypt.

Exodus 3:11-Message

But why me? What makes you think that I could ever go to the Pharaoh and lead the children of Israel out of Egypt?

Exodus 3:12-NKJV

<u>I will certainly be with you</u>... When you have brought the people out of Egypt, you shall serve God on this mountain.

Exodus 3:13, NKJV

Indeed when I come to the children of Israel and say to them, —The God of your fathers has sent me to you . . . what shall I say to them?

Exodus 3:14-NKJV

And God said to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM." And He said, "Thus you shall say to the children of Israel, 'I AM has sent me to you.'"

Galatians 1:10-Passion

I'm obviously not trying to flatter you or water down my message **to be popular with men**, but **my supreme passion is to please God.** For if all I attempt to do is please people, I would not be the true servant of the Messiah.

Exodus 16:3-TLB

Oh, that we were back in Egypt, they moaned, —and that the Lord had killed us there! For there we had plenty to eat. But now you have brought us into this wilderness to kill us with starvation.

Exodus 16:7-NKJV

And in the morning you shall see the glory of the Lord; for He hears your complaints against the Lord.

Rephidim - **ref-ee-deem'**- a station of Israel in the wilderness between Egypt and Sinai.

The <u>wilderness</u> symbolizes a place of <u>unsatisfied hunger</u>. <u>Rephidim</u> symbolizes a place of *spiritual thirst*.

Exodus 17:3-NKJV

Why is it you have brought us up out of Egypt to kill us and our children and our livestock with thirst?

Exodus-17:5-6-NKJV

Go on before the people, and take with you some of the elders of Israel. Also take in your hand your rod with which you struck the river and go. Behold I will stand before you there on the rock in Horeb; and you shall strike the rock, and water will come out of it, that the people may drink.

The rod was symbolic of Moses dependence upon God.

The rock was symbolic of <u>Jesus/Our Father/Holy Spirit</u>, and Gods great <u>favor</u> upon Moses.
