THE LORD WILL PROVIDE FOR YOU. Sunday, Sept 10th, 2023 Audie Clairmont

Gen 22:4-14-NKJB

- 4 Then on the third day Abraham lifted his eyes and saw the place afar off.
- **5** And Abraham said to his young men, "Stay here with the donkey; the lad and *I will go yonder and worship*, and *we will come back to you."*
- **6** So Abraham took the wood of the burnt offering and laid *it* on Isaac his son; and he took the fire in his hand, and a knife, and the two of them went together.
- 7 But Isaac spoke to Abraham his father and said, "My father!" And he said, "Here I am, my son." Then he said, "Look, the fire and the wood, but where *is* the lamb for a burnt offering?"
- **8** And Abraham said, "My son, <u>God will provide for Himself the lamb for a burnt offering."</u> So the two of them went together.
- 9 Then they came to the place of which God had told him. And Abraham built an altar there and placed the wood in order; and he bound Isaac his son and laid him on the altar, upon the wood.

Moriah means <u>"chosen by Yahweh"</u> and comes from a root word meaning <u>"sight,"</u> or <u>"vision."</u>

- 10 And Abraham stretched out his hand and took the knife to slay his son.
- **11** But the Angel of the LORD called to him from heaven and said, "Abraham, Abraham!" So he said, "Here I am."
- 12 And He said, "Do not lay your hand on the lad, or do anything to him; for now I know that you fear God, since you have not withheld your son, your only *son*, from Me."
- **13** Then Abraham lifted his eyes and looked, and there behind *him was* a ram caught in a thicket by its horns. So Abraham went and took the ram, and offered it up for a burnt offering instead of his son.
- 14 And Abraham called the name of the place, <u>The-LORD-Will-Provide</u>; as it is said *to* this day, <u>"In the Mount of the LORD it shall be provided."</u>

Abraham called the name of that place:

Yahweh Yi'reh, (Jehovah jireh), that is, literally, the LORD <u>Will Provide</u>, or even more significant, "the LORD <u>Will See to It</u>". "Yahweh <u>sees (to it)"</u> or "Yahweh provides."

The literal meaning of yir'eh (rā'āh,), "to see.", rā'āh denotes seeing with the eyes.

"provide" – Latin - providēre, "to see ahead,"

Passion-V14 - So Abraham named that place <u>Yahweh Appears</u>. Even to this day, it is said, <u>"On Yahweh's Mountain there is vision."</u>

- 8 Yes, God is more than ready to overwhelm you with every form of grace, so that you will have more than enough of everything—every moment and in every way. He will make you overflow with abundance <u>in every good</u> thing you do.
- **9** Just as the Scriptures say <u>about the one who trusts in him:</u> Because he has sown extravagantly and given to the poor, his kindness and generous deeds <u>will never be forgotten.</u>
- 10 This generous God who supplies abundant seed for the farmer, which becomes bread for our meals, is even more extravagant toward you. First he supplies every need, plus more. Then he multiplies the seed as you sow it, so that the harvest of your generosity will grow.
- 11 You will be abundantly enriched in every way as you give generously on every occasion, for when we take your gifts to those in need, it causes many to give thanks to God.
