

THE MERCIES OF GOD NEVER RUN OUT.

Lamentations 3:17-26-Jewish Public Society Version

17 And my soul is removed far off from peace, I forgot prosperity.
18 And I said: 'My strength is perished, and mine expectation from the LORD.'
19 Remember mine affliction and mine anguish, the wormwood and the gall.
20 My soul hath them still in remembrance, and is bowed down within me.
21 This I recall to my mind, therefore have I hope.
22 **Surely the LORD'S mercies are not consumed, surely His compassions fail not.**
23 **They are new every morning; great is Thy faithfulness.**
24 'The LORD is my portion', saith my soul; 'Therefore will I hope in Him.'
25 The LORD is good unto them that wait for Him, to the soul that seeketh Him.
26 It is good that a man should quietly wait for the salvation of the LORD.

21 *This I recall to my mind, therefore have, I hope.*

Amp ...But this I recall and therefore have I hope and expectation...

NLT - ...Yet I still dare to hope when I remember this:

22 **Surely the LORD'S mercies are not consumed, surely His compassions fail not.**
23 **They are new every morning; great is Thy faithfulness.**

"mercies" - Hebrew is "*chasad*" (*khaw-sad*) - lovingkindness and mercy. *The lovingkindness of God is a portal to His heart and a joining of our hearts to His*, so that we may find peace and rest for our souls.

...the mercies of God are never consumed...

"consume" is *tamam*, (*taw-mam*) which *carries the idea of completion*. *The road to God's heart is never completed; there is no end*. Also suggests *a cycle or process*. This cycle will never end; it just keeps spiraling around. It is a cycle that carries the revealed Word of God and hidden knowledge of God.

We only limit ourselves to God's revelation through our own experience with God.

23 *"They are new every morning..."*

"new" is *chadash*, which has a dual meaning of either brand new or renewed. There is something *new every morning* and *something within us is being renewed or restored*.

God's Word is only limited by the amount of your heart that you are willing to share with Him.

...His compassions fail not...

fail has two possible roots, which could both be relevant to this verse. *kaleh'*, (*kaw-leh'*) which *carries the idea of being confined and not allowed total expression*. *kalah*, (*kaw-law*) which means *to be destroyed*.

"compassion" is *racham*, (*rakh'-am*) which is a very romantic word and not only means *love* but *to "love tenderly"*. A *tender love* is a ministering love. *...cannot be confined* but must be allowed a *total expression* and on top of that, *it can never be destroyed*.

2Corinthians 1:3-Passion

All praises belong to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. For he is the Father of tender mercy and the God of endless comfort.

Romans 8:35-Passion

Who could ever separate us from the endless love of God's Anointed One? *Absolutely no one!* For nothing in the universe has the power to diminish his love toward us. Troubles, pressures, and problems are unable to come between us and heaven's love. What about persecutions, deprivations, dangers, and death threats? No, for they are all impotent to hinder omnipotent love,...

"faithfulness" is from Hebrew *root word "amen"*. (*H539*). *This word in its primitive meaning has the idea of a mother nursing a child*.

24 'The LORD is my portion', saith my soul; 'Therefore will I hope in Him.'
25 The LORD is good unto them that wait for Him, to the soul that seeketh Him.
26 It is good that a man should quietly wait for the salvation of the LORD.

Psalms 25:6-AMP
